WHAT IS HEI?



INAUGURAL PRESIDENTS' CONFERENCE SPEAKERS



DR. JAY BOX

Dr. Jay Box was named the second president of the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) on November 19, 2014. He is a community college graduate and has more than 30 years of experience in community college leadership.

Dr. Box has a history of leadership within KCTCS, having served as the president of Hazard Community and Technical College from 2002 – 2007, followed by being named KCTCS vice president. In 2009, he was named chancellor and served in that role until being selected president of the System.



LISA MARSH RYERSON

Lisa Marsh Ryerson is president of AARP Foundation, the charitable affiliate of AARP. A bold, disciplined and collaborative leader, she sets the Foundation's strategic direction and steers its efforts to realize an audacious vision: a country free of poverty, where no older person feels vulnerable. Since she took the helm, AARP Foundation has implemented pioneering initiatives, explored new avenues for collaboration, and secured unprecedented funding to support programs and services that truly change lives. Ms. Ryerson has spearheaded innovative partnerships with other organizations to create and advance effective solutions that help vulnerable older adults increase their economic opportunity and social connectedness. Before joining AARP Foundation, Ms. Ryerson served as the president and CEO of Wells College in Aurora, N.Y.



DR. MARY LANDON DARDEN

Dr. Mary Landon Darden became the President of HEI, LLC in 2015 after serving for five years as the Center Dean of Concordia University Texas San Antonio. She holds a doctorate from the Scholars of Practice program in Higher Education Administration at Baylor University, and has more than two decades of higher education administration experience. She is the author of a book published with the American Council on Education and Rowman and Littlefield titled *Beyond 2020: Envisioning the Future of Universities in America*.



DR. JOANNA KILE

Dr. Joanna Kile is currently Vice President of Instruction at Texas Southmost College. She also has served as the Associate Vice Chancellor of Workforce Instruction and Executive Director of the Global Energy Training Institute at Houston Community College. She holds a doctorate in in higher education administration from Baylor University and a master's degree in human genetics from the University of North Texas. With more than twenty years of community college administration experience, her focus remains innovation in workforce education.

Dr. MEREDITH WOO

Dr. Woo, former dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Virginia, left her job in London as director of the international higher education support program at the Open Society Foundations to lead Sweet Briar College. An expert on international political economy and East Asian politics, Woo has written and edited seven books, and was the executive producer of an award-winning documentary film, "Koryo Saram: The Unreliable People." Meredith Woo is now leading Sweet Briar College to serve as the model for liberal arts colleges of the future. When selecting Sweet Briar as one of the Most Innovative Schools, the 2019 *U.S. News & World Report* Best Colleges rankings noted that in addition to curating an academic curriculum built on its areas of excellence, the College reduced tuition to make the superlative education at Sweet Briar affordable and the true cost more transparent.



DR. ROBERT CLOUD

Dr. Robert Cloud is a professor of higher education and chair of the Department of Educational Leadership (EDL) at Baylor University. He holds four academic degrees and is a former community college administrator, having served as president of Lee College in Texas for ten years and as vice president and dean in three other Texas colleges. Dr. Cloud's current research interests include higher education leadership, educational law and policy, current issues, governance, the federal student loan program and student debt, and organizational behavior.



DR. GREG LEMAN

Dr. Greg Leman is a Clinical Professor in Entrepreneurship at Baylor University. His current role is focused on gaining early stage funding that enables Baylor-research-based tech companies to launch in the local region. He recently served as a Loaned Executive, filling the role of Executive Director for Start Up Waco, a newly founded nonprofit whose mission is to formalize and optimize the greater Waco ecosystem for entrepreneurship. He is the Founder of the LAUNCH Innovative Business Accelerator at the Baylor Research and Innovation Collaborative (BRIC). Over the past 11 years as a tech-biz venture coach he has accumulated a 75% success rate in taking teams to their next major strategic milestone, and his clients include national innovation competition winners.



DR. ALEX PARNIA

Dr. Alex Parnia currently is the president MSM-USA, a leading worldwide platform supporting the international education sector. Prior to joining MSM, Dr. Parnia was the president of EC Higher Education, where he formed pathway partnerships with U.S. universities that are ranked in the top 200 by *U.S. News and World Report*. Previously, as president of Pacific Oaks College & Children's School, he closed a deficit gap of \$4 million within 24 months, increased revenue from \$8 million to \$22 million and grew the enrollment from 480 to 1300 students within three years. Dr. Parnia has also served as provost of Nichols College, executive vice president of Cambridge College and was a tenured faculty member.


